This week we had school photos and parent-teacher interviews. Thank you to our parents for making the effort to attend these meetings to find out how your children are progressing at school, and how you can help them at home to improve their learning.

Coming soon...

We have been working hard on a few 'in school' solutions to improve student achievement. We are going to be using e-AsTTle (electronic assessment teaching tool of learning) consistently across the school, particularly to assess writing. This is going to help us make accurate decisions about the levels for individual students in writing and what their next steps will be. We are also putting all of our student achievement data onto Assembly (Student Management System) to build cumulative student records and to have ONE place to access data. Over the next couple of weeks we hope to have I Pad minis in rooms 3-8. Rooms 1 and 2 will be able to use the tablets, which are currently spread across the whole school.

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Room 8 has had a great start to term 3! We have started this term off with undertaking science investigations.

Last week we looked at the



effect of ice and salt on different substances. First we saw how ice melts faster when salt has been added to it. We learnt that they add salt onto frozen roads to make it melt faster so it is safer to drive on. (Liam)

Second, we attempted to make salt crystals on a piece of cotton using a solution saturated in salt, some appeared overnight and some still have not formed! **Some people had some crystals appear but they sunk to the bottom of the jar.** (Jesee)

What appeared to be one of the favourite experiments last week was making ice cream! We compared two bags of vanilla flavoured milk that were shaken up inside another larger bag of ice. One bag of ice had salt added to it. We found that if the ice had no salt added to it, the milk solution would stay as milk. When mixed with ice and salt it lowered the temperature of the bag of milk so froze and created ice cream. The ice cream was freezing but easy to make. The end when we tasted it, it was creamy and divine! (James) At the end of last week we saw the effect of salt absorbing water, but in this case it was dye that we painted onto paper. I was surprised with how the salt affected the dye. Teresa-Ann

This week we have started learning about aerodynamics and how 'lift' and 'thrust' are essential in the flying of planes. We experimented with speed and distance based on the type of balloon and string used (to travel on). We found elevating the end where we let the balloon go caused greater speed and distance. It was cool and fun to do. My team always won. (Grant)

Yesterday we flew paper airplanes and compared the distance while using different types and sizes of paper airplanes.


