I had an inspirational time at the National Principal's Federation Conference last week. We had a number of outstanding and thought provoking speakers from around the world. These are changing times in education where we need to rethink how we are preparing our students for futures in a world that is full of change and where their occupations will be different to what we have experienced. Employers are looking for people with skills in problem solving, working collaboratively, creativity, good communication skills and critical thinkers. We need to ask our children open ended questions to encourage them to think and develop their critical thinking skills. Our theme at the conference was creativity and we were entertained by talented young people but also had opportunities to be creative ourselves. I thoroughly enjoyed listening to a young lady that shared her work experiences at Weta Workshop. What an incredible place to work if you are a creative person.

I have some excellent news; we will be holding on to our five classroom teachers for next year. Two positions will be advertised this week as two of our current teachers are in fixed term positions. This will make the classes smaller than I had anticipated which is good for everyone. Saskia Van den Beld has resigned from her permanent position and is going to be an at home mum with her two young children. Hopefully we will still be able to get her out here on occassions to relieve.

We have been analysising our attendance data and it is concerning that when compared to other schools in Southland, other similar socio-economic schools, and all other schools we have low attendance. Of particular concern is the fact that 60% of our children were absent for 90% or more in term two. Regular attendance is considered over 90% of half days. We have a lot of children leaving early in the afternoons. Some of this has come about because of sport that starts at 3:30 in town. If you are the coach of a team in this situation, please ask that our teams not be played in the first round. Think carefully before taking children out of school. Is it because they are sick; is it educational for them? If not, then work out how you can get them to school. It is unsettling for children not to be part of a regular programme and difficult for teachers to provide the programme that they need.

At the end of the year, we will be taking the whole school to Curio Bay to take part in a learning programme where they can learn from our environment first-hand. Our local community has put so much work into Tumu Toka CurioScape and it is important for all of our children to see this and take advantage of optimal learning from this wonderful facility. We will be working in house groups and taking part in a number of activities in the Curio Bay area while we are there.
