#### **Strike Action**

Teachers and principals have decided not to accept the Government's latest collective agreement offer because they feel it does not address teacher recruitment and retention, workload and pay claim issues.

NZEI members have voted for an unprecedented second strike, to be held next month. There will be nationwide rolling strikes over a week, and our region will be striking on **Friday 16 November.** 

Our school will be closed on that date. We regret the inconvenience we know this will cause.

NZEI are asking for:

- Smaller classes, so our children can get more oneon-one attention
- More resources and staffing to adequately support children with additional learning needs – this will benefit all children because teachers will be freed to spend more one-on-one time with every student
- A significant increase in teachers' salaries so that they are properly valued for their qualifications and responsibilities, and as a country we can recruit and retain teachers.
