School Fair



The reason for the stalemate in negotiations at this stage is that teachers need a pay jolt to address the teacher shortages. The current pay rates do not encourage young people to join the profession and this has led to the teacher shortages, which are very real. We are lucky at St Leo's to have a stable staff. Another sticking point in the negotiations is the lack of support for children with severe learning challenges.
