With Term 4 racing by, tomorrow we are celebrating the achievements of our pupils in the Sporting arena. Our Sports Prizegiving will start at 2pm in the school gym. We ask parents and whanau to be seated by 1:50pm. We are pleased to be welcoming Grace Brooker as our guest speaker. Grace is an ex-pupil of Hurunui College who earlier this year gained acknowledgment for all her hard work by receiving a NZ Rugby central contract. It will be fantastic to see all our community there for this event and it will be a great opportunity to celebrate the sporting success from over the year. We ask that all students present themselves in correct uniform, respectfully and portray the positive image of the school.

Next Monday, 5th November, will be the last day for our Year 11-13 students as they head off to their NCEA exams. This is always a big day for our Year 13 students and a huge milestone as many finish their formal education and head off into employment or future study. We will be hosting our final full school assembly on Monday afternoon from 2.15pm onwards to recognise our senior leavers and give them the opportunity to say goodbye to the school. All parents and community members are welcome to attend this assembly. Also our Year 13 leavers have gone to a big effort to make this a positive day and have organised a sausage sizzle at lunchtime for pupils and staff (\$2 per sausage). I think this, along with other events they have planned, is an excellent legacy to remember them by.

As our students head into their exam preparation it is a chance for parents to ensure that what they are doing at home is also conducive to positive preparation for exams. Research shows students perform significantly better when parents are actively engaged with them, providing encouragement and ensuring study is happening. Just because they are 16 or 17 does not mean they can suddenly manage themselves. Some very simple practices can make a huge difference.

1. Ensure your child has a quiet and comfortable place to study away from distraction. This may be the kitchen table or a table area in the bedroom. Turn TV's off and put cell phones aside during this time. Quiet music can be beneficial.

- Encourage study to be focused. Help them structure and spend a set amount of time on each exam preparation and allow short breaks every 30/40mins.
- 3. Ensure your child receives adequate sleep. Late nights and broken sleep are not conducive to study and achievement in exams.
- Encourage them to hold off on any celebrations until after they have finished all of their exams. A little sacrifice over the next few weeks may make a huge difference.

During exam leave pupils are welcome to come to school and study in designated rooms, or work with their subject teachers. A reminder that for the exams it is recommended they arrive 20 minutes before the start time, in full school uniform. A number of exams will run late into the afternoon so pupils will need to make their own arrangements to get home as the school buses will have left.

Lastly the End of Year school Prizegiving will be held on Thursday 13th December. We ask that all parents, caregivers and community who wish to attend, please aim to be seated by 9:45 am, with a start time for the Prizegiving being 10.00 am. We are expecting Prizegiving to be completed by 11:30-12 pm. The buses will run at 12.15 pm for those who are not intending to head home with family.

HAWARDEN SWIMMING POOL A big thank you to all the people who helped drain and clean the pool on Saturday. Special thanks to Hawarden Fire Brigade for their help with the pumping, and to Rob Topp (and his assistants) for the repairs and water-blasting. The pool is full and undergoing water treatment. We hope to open before the end of next week, weather and chemicals permitting. Keep an eye on the school newsletter, the school or Hawarden Swimming Club Facebook pages.

Hurunui College allows the Hawarden Swimming Club to run the pool outside school time to make it available for the community. Compared to other places in North Canterbury we enjoy excellent pool access at a very reasonable price. We are pleased to say our prices remain the same as last year.

There are 2 ways to use our pool.

- Households can purchase a pool key for \$60. This gives access to the pool throughout the season for anyone living in the household.
- Locals and visitors can pay \$2 per swimmer (for the whole day) into the honesty box at the pool. There must be a keyholder at the pool to let you in.

Keyholders DO NOT lend keys.

Continued community use of the pool relies on everyone respecting the rules and the facilities. The Club has amended the pool rules, a copy will be made available to all keyholders. Two concerns from last season that users need to be aware of are, the use of sound systems at the pool and the use of the jump seat. Both these just need people to show consideration towards other pool users. If you have a pool key from last season you can Internet bank your \$60 into 03-1582-0012259-00 including your surname and key number as references. Keys can be paid for or purchased from the Hawarden Library or from Bronwyn Gunn.
