- At the end of 2018, we farewell the wonderful Ms Betsy Flynn who is going on her travels to London to begin her OE and have adventures. We welcome Ms Laura Wansink as the Room 13 teacher for 2019. We have also appointed a new experienced teacher as the new teacher for Room 18 Ms Samantha McRae joins our staff in 2019. Samanta comes to us with an extra qualification in Sport and Recreation and states Science as her subject of strength and passion. The Maternity Leave position left vacant by Ms Melling will have our wonderful Ms Sujata Dubey in Room 19 until her return. We will also farewell Mr Michael August-Sutherland at the end of 2018 who has relieved in the position left vacant by Ms Youle (in Doha)
- The Year 7/8 students completed their ATTITUDE programme on "WHO AM I" strengthening their self awareness and identity this term
- A round of full staff appraisals began in Week 3 and by the end of Week 4, all 40 staff members will have completed an appraisal. One thing to report is that our teachers are highly competent in the coverage of the Standards for Teachers, given the alignment from our strategic plan goals carefully planned to link fully into classroom teacher goals to ensure setting our teachers up for success.
