

Attention all Parents

Auckland Regional Public Health Service (ARPHS) has been advised that a few children at the Sunnybrae Normal School have recently had symptoms associated with stomach illness, including vomiting and/or diarrhoea. We would like your help in order to prevent other children from becoming ill.

The following are general points about to viral gastroenteritis:

- Symptoms include vomiting, diarrhoea, fever, and stomach cramps.
- Symptoms usually last for 4-6 days
- The illness can be easily passed onto others (especially family members) through the inhalation of vomit particles or direct hand contact
- As the pathogen can continue to be excreted in the faeces (poo) of infected people for up to 30 days increased hand hygiene is necessary.
- People can be infected with the pathogen without exhibiting symptoms, so everyone
 in the household should increase hand hygiene. This means 20 seconds hand
 washing and 20 seconds hand drying dry after going to the toilet, before preparing
 or eating food and after contact with unwell people or pets.
- The pathogen can live for long periods of time on surfaces (such as toilet seats, bench tops etc) so increased cleaning is required. Cleaning fluids containing sodium hypochlorite such as **bleach** are the only substances that will inactivate the pathogen.
- In order to prevent the spread of the illness, it is imperative that children suffering
 from symptoms of diarrhoea and/or vomiting do not attend school until free of
 any symptoms for at least 48 hours.
