Speaking of excellent achievements, well done also, to Mrs Stevens who had great success competing in the Equestrian events at the Christchurch Show last week. Lana won the Open Round the Ring as well as placing 2nd and 4th in two other events.

At staff meeting this week, we had Sport Southland Community Sport Manager, Luciana Garcia come and run a workshop with us to help us plan for our Health and PE focus curriculum focus next year. At this meeting we also looked at the feedback we had received from last term's parent survey, and what parents felt were the most important aspects of Health and PE for the school to include in our programme. There were 12 parents who responded to this survey. Common threads were: Health and PE was seen as very important for us to teach; Parents told us that they thought the more important aspects were: Self Care, Self Worth (really important), Keeping Ourselves Safe, Daily Fitness, Friendships, Self Esteem. Less important were: Cross Country, and Gymnastics. Sort of in the middle were: Nutrition, Sexuality Education, Body Care, Coping with Change, Playground games, Athletics, Team Sports, Sportsmanship. We appreciated this useful input. Next year we intend to line our Health and PE programmes so they are driven more

directly by the Curriculum rather that contexts to 'cover' (e.g Large Balls). We want our programme to be driven by the focus of the HPE curriculum which is on the well-being of students through healthrelated movement concepts.



We are very grateful for the support we've had from parents to enable the children to make the most of the opportunity to enjoy the pool, with our good adult-child ratio enabling a large group to be in the pool at once and minimise 'wait time'.
