



It is hard to believe that there are just under two weeks of school remaining before the end of the year. Prizegiving plans are in full swing and before we know it the summer break will be upon us. The full school Prizegiving will be held on Thursday 13th December. We ask that all parents, caregivers and community that wish to attend, please be seated by 9.50 am, with a start time for the Prizegiving being 10.00 am. We are expecting prizegiving to be completed by 12 pm. For those who are not intending to head home with family, the buses will run at 12.30 pm. Parents and caregivers, please be aware that students will be home approximately two and half hours earlier on Prizegiving day.

It is important that parents ensure ALL students are in correct uniform as this will be checked prior to the start of the Prizegiving. This is especially important for our Y11-13 students. We ask that all students present themselves respectfully and in the correct uniform.

At the beginning of the week, I had the pleasure of spending a couple of days up in Wellington with the Investigating Community. The classes are braving the poor weather and having a fantastic time and making the most of their time in Wellington. As always when away from school our students represent the school with pride. We look forward to meeting them at the airport this evening and know there will be many smiling but tired faces amongst the returning group, including parents and teachers.

The end of this year will bring to conclusion a couple of long-held institutions in the school.

Firstly the weekly school newsletter will not continue next year. We have been considering this decision for a couple of years now and feel that the timing is right to shift to alternative means of communication with our school community. We understand that the school newsletter has served a wider purpose for many organisations in our community but sadly the core purpose of communicating with our school community has become ineffectual. We are currently using multiple mediums and want to now focus on pushing information out via our webpage, school app and facebook page. We also feel that the newsletter is not capturing all that is happening for our children and we want to better showcase what is going on in the school. We will be shifting to a termly journal that will better highlight what has been happening in the classes, contain

more photos and write-ups and become a better record of what has gone on over the term. It will also highlight what is coming up in the following term.

We, along with many other schools, have seen a loss of enthusiasm for the school magazine and feel it is time to reinvent it. We feel the shift to the four termly journals will better reflect what is traditionally contained within the end of year magazine. This year we will still be producing a magazine in a slightly reduced format that will be available for download via our website or you can request a copy at cost via the office.

After Hours There is <u>always</u> a doctor or rural nurse specialist on call - please phone the Health Centre on the number below during normal business hours <u>and</u> after hours and you will be directed to the appropriate assistance. The After Hours calls are managed by HML (Homecare Medical Ltd) who will assess your needs and advise your best course of action. The on call clinician is able to access patient records, if required, to improve patient safety.

Free for Under 14 years for ACC and Medical visits for enrolled patients, from 1 December 2018.

**Zostavax (Shingles vaccine)** Free for 65-80 year olds. Meningitis Serotype W – there has been a two fold increase in the number of cases of this from last year to this year. It is often difficult to diagnose as it has atypical symptoms. Please seek medical advice if you are concerned about your own illness or someone else who is very unwell.

**Smoking Cessation Advice** is available at the Health Centre if you need help to quit smoking.

**Appetite for Life** would you be interested in attending a course once a week for six weeks, locally, that shows you how to prepare nutritional meal and snack ideas for the family and how to make healthy choices around food and lifestyle? This is open to both men and women of any age. Please ring and talk to the practice nurse if you are interested in this.

**Repeat Prescriptions** Eligibility for these must be discussed with the **NEW GP** prior to a request. It is best practice to see the GP every three months for a prescription to be reissued. If permission has been granted then 48 hours notice is to be given. Please ensure you keep track of your medication supplies to avoid running out.

**SUMMER!** When it arrives please be mindful about being sum smart (hat, sunscreen, protective clothing) and keeping **well hydrated** by drinking plenty of **water**.
