To start the 2019 school year we will be teaching the NZ Police 'Keeping Ourselves Safe' programme. This programme is written by the police in conjunction with teachers, and teaches children what to do if they are in a situation where they feel unsafe. The police have recommended that it is best practice to run this programme every second year and we last taught this in 2017. We want to start the year with this as it will help set expectations for the children and set a positive tone in the school.

As part of this Senior Constable Louise Nicholas will be running some parent sessions to explain content and answer any queries parents and caregivers may have. This will be held on the 7th February 2019 and we will send details out at the start of next year
