Secondly, it was great to see Miriam Clark publicly recognise for being awarded one of three \$18,000 scholarships to the University of Canterbury. Uniform update: We have finalised the selection of the polo top for our Year 1-8 students and have selected a slightly more modern take on the current polo top worn. This will be embroidered with the school emblem, but in most ways is a continuation of what we currently have. We are now all set for the uniform selection to go live on the Mainland Uniforms website,

(www.mainlanduniforms.co.nz) and will also be available

from their Wairaki Rd store. This will allow families to access the uniform over the summer break in preparation for 2019. 2019 will be a transition year to allow families time to purchase the new uniform. It will be expected that from 2020 that all students are in the new uniform. I will be offering a \$50 (for Year 9-13 students) and \$30 (for Year 0-8 students) per student uniform subsidy to assist families who need some assistance. We are hoping to be able to add this as a credit once a Mainland Uniform account is set up. If families wish to apply for this prior to next year, please simply send a short note to school, addressed to the Principal, simply stating the number of children and that you wish to be considered for the subsidy.

End of year details: The full school Prizegiving will be held on Thursday 13th December. We ask that all parents, caregivers and community who wish to attend, please be seated by 9.50 am, with the start time for the Prizegiving being 10.00 am. We are expecting prizegiving to be completed by 12 o'clock. For those who are not intending to head home with family, the buses will run at 12.30 pm. Parents and caregivers, please be aware that students will be home approximately two and half hours earlier on Prizegiving day. It is important that parents ensure ALL students are incorrect uniform as this will be checked prior to the start of the Prizegiving. This is especially important for our Year 11-13 students. We ask that all students present themselves respectfully and in the correct uniform.

Start of year details: The school office will be open for enrolments and inquiries from the 21st January. Rolling start dates are as follow; Year 11-13 students - 29th January, Year 1-10 - 30th January, full school - 31st January.

I wish all families, students and the community a very Merry and safe Christmas and holiday period. For those leaving us at the end of the year, I wish you all the best of luck in your future endeavours and hope you will take away happy memories of your time at Hurunui College. For those returning, we will look forward to seeing you back fit and healthy in the New Year.

HURUNUI DISTRICT COUNCIL Refuse and Recycling Christmas and New Year Arrangements

Over Christmas and New Year, there will be NO change to the collection day for refuse and recycling in Hawarden and Waikari with collections being as usual on a Thursday. As pick-up times may vary to normal, please ensure Hurunui Council refuse and recycling bags are at the kerbside boundary of the property by 8am on collection day.

ONLY Hurunui Council refuse and recycling bags will be collected, non-complying bags will be stickered and left. Bags can be purchased from Hawarden Four Square and Waikari Auto Services; please remember:

- ⇒ Refuse and recycling bags must NOT contain glass bottles; these can be recycled these via council's transfer stations for no charge.
- ⇒ Bags must not exceed 15kg in weight and must be securely tied.
- ⇒ Bags must not contain anything, which could endanger the collector or damage the vehicle e.g. medical or hazardous waste, needles, animal waste, ashes, sharp objects or liquids.
- ⇒ Bags split before the contractors arrival and noncomplying bags, are not the crew's responsibility to clean up.

Transfer Station Arrangements

Hurunui Council transfer stations are closed on public holidays, at all other times, normal opening hours apply. Please DO NOT leave refuse and recycling outside the transfer stations when they are closed. This will be deemed illegally dumped under the Litter Act (1979), Sections 14 and 15 for which an infringement maybe issued.

Via the transfer stations glass bottles, paper, cardboard, plastic bottles, clean food and drink cans can be recycled for no charge. Please follow signage and staff guidance on site at all times.

WAIKARI MURAL

The Hurunui Community Committee has secured funding and support from various sources, to put a mural on the reservoir tank above the Waikari village. We have engaged Margot Korhonen to design and produce this mural – you will have noticed her mural on the old pharmacy building in Amberley, and may also have seen her Waiau mural. Margot's design brief was:

- The mural needs to be bold enough to stand out from a distance, but offer interesting detail close up
- Encompass the Hawarden and Waikari area
- Themes to consider include: Frog Rock; sheep, beef and arable farming tapestry of paddocks; flour mill; moa bones; Maori Rock Art; Weka Pass railway; limestone / works; Waikari Hospital; mountains (as it's beside the plane table)
- It could depict a past to present theme, as you walk around the tank

The Committee felt the design submitted by Margot met the brief very well and it has been approved. Preparation of the tank is underway.

We invite you to watch the mural taking shape over the next two months. Unfortunately the scaffolding is considered a heath and safety risk, so we need to view it from a distance, until it is completed.

Once it is completed a community event to celebrate this will be held.


