WELCOME BACK

Hi everyone and welcome back to the 2019 school year. We hope you have all had a great break, have managed to recharge the batteries over the holidays, and are set for another big year that has come upon us so quickly. Our starting roll this year is 50.....yes 50!!!!. A huge welcome to Harvey Fairbrother who starts his learning journey with us in Timatanga. We are excited to be in three learning spaces this year and this is due to our increasing roll, ministry funding and from your Board of Trustees future planning and support of our school programmes. Leading the learning in Timatanga will be Heather Stevens and 13 Year 0-2 students, in Whanake will be Jane Tiley with 16 Year 2 – 4 students and in Whakatutuki will be Sandy Taylor and myself with our 21 amazing Year 5-8 learners. We pride ourselves on allowing plenty of one on one support for students and also for students to be involved in a wide range of opportunities that everyone can take part in. In many larger schools the numbers dictate the need to select certain students for activities, but it is great that we seem to still be able to take everyone to everything. We have a wide range of new initiatives this year and we will attempt to give you a heads-up and brief description of the upcoming events over the next couple of weeks.

SCHOOL CHARTER

We have included the strategic aims from our school charter and it is a direct reflection of our and your ambitions and goals for our students. We are currently finalising our annual plan for 2019 and the targets will be made available soon. The staff will meet and look over our beginning year data and decide on the focus for our students so we can continue to strive towards achieving the 3 strategic aims. The Board of Trustees will also be heavily involved in the design of our strategic and annual plan.

Strategic Aim 1: All students will leave Whareama School at or above their respective curriculum levels in reading, writing and mathematics.

Strategic Aim 2: All students at Whareama School will be self-managing, independent learners through emphasis on the Key Competencies and values.

Strategic Aim 3: Our students will be worldly 21st century citizens, who are resilient, socially responsible, resourceful and confident in their own identity.

CURRICULUM

This year we have decided to run a theme called 'Culture Club'. We have a huge variety of tasks that we will be working on with the kids and there will be a major focus on arts, drama, dance and cultures from around the world. We are playing a wide range of fun, project based activities that will allow the students to develop their own questions and then seek answers to questions, problem solve, explain findings and evaluate their learning. We are studying numeracy, measurement and time in our mathematics unit and our literacy focus this term is guided reading and individualised writing skills. We are doing aquatics and cricket skills for our physical education unit and portraits for art. Our second language programme will focus on Maori greetings and classroom instruction. The students will be taking part in a wide range of activities that will involve activities at school and also many activities out of school. In Term 3 we will be having our bi-annual production and more information will be out about this next term.

WILLIAM PIKE CHALLENGE

A new initiative for our Year 7 and 8 students will have them taking part in the William Pike Challenge over 2019. We will be doing this alongside the Year 7/8 students from Wainuioru School and it is a very cool and exciting programme. HOMEWORK

All classrooms will be starting homework in Week 3 and this will consist of reading, spelling, mathematics through Maths Buddy or Mathletics and any work that requires completion from unfinished class work. You will also receive a class newsletter from your classrooms this week, to outline some of the other bits and pieces of news you may need starting the school year.

DESIGN TECHNOLOGY

This year the Year 7 and 8 students who will be going to Design Technology at Makoura College on Fridays from Week 8 this term. There is a separate letter coming home for each of these students later this term to remind you about this programme. The school van leaves school at 10am each Friday and

returns in the afternoon for all students. There is a cost of \$20 each term as part of the take home component and this will be billed at the end of term.

STATIONERY

Most of the junior room students have all of their stationery at school however at the end of the year the senior students took home most of their books and stationery. Any books that the children are missing will be supplied to from our stationery cupboard on Monday next week. We foresee most students only needing the odd book here and there and this will be a minimal cost added to your account. We would like all children to have their own felts and colouring pencils. These are a couple of things that we do not sell through our stationery cupboard at school, so if you could find the time to please go and get these for your children that would be greatly appreciated. If you purchase these from the Warehouse Stationery please nominate our school, it will go towards us getting cash back at the end of the year.

SWIMMING - IN SCHOOL AND LESSONS

Every child in the school will be part of the regular, daily classroom swimming programme so please remember to send them along with their togs and a towel in a swim bag each day. We also have Rebecca O'Neale back on board this year to take swimming lessons after school on Tuesdays and Thursdays. The cost will be \$10 per lesson and it will run over 5 weeks from Weeks 3-7. Each child will be ability grouped and then have a 30 minute lesson after school each day, in our school pool. KI-O-RAHI COASTAL CLASSIC

On Friday the 1st of March our school is hosting the third annual Ki-o-rahi sports tournament. This will be at Riversdale Beach and will be run with Whaiora and Kokiri Te Puna from Wellington. We have around 200 students from schools in the Wairarapa coming to this and we will be entering hopefully two teams.
