There will be many guests including the Ministry, local dignitaries, our Māori kaiako, the media and those involved with the upgrade. Curriculum Development 2019

Our teachers attended 3 professional development days over the last week. This upskilling supports our Strategic Plan goals for our learners and teachers (see attached copy). Our goal for our learners is to empower them so that they are able to use their Active Learner skills and competencies to enable them to be successful both now and in the future.

Learning-Centred Spaces (Facilitator: Bek Galloway)

We will be teaching our students to develop their Active Learner skills, which include self-management, actively setting goals and actively taking responsibility for their learning. You will hear your children talking about Bronze and Silver level learning and see them grow in confidence as they collaborate with their peers.

Digital Curriculum (Facilitator: Lynne Silcock, Core Education)

This new technology curriculum must be introduced in 2020 – we're starting now! Funnily enough, a lot of this learning does not involve using digital devices – it is more about developing patterned and algebraic thinking, which can which then be applied to other areas of learning (e.g. coding, creative design etc.).

Collaborative Teaching Teams (Facilitator: Mark Sweeney)

Together with 15 teachers from Paparangi School we unpacked what Innovative Learning Environments (ILE) look like when teaching teams are working effectively as collaborative and skilful communicators. Our families will be the best judges of whether this is happening over the year ahead!
