# Dear Parents/Caregivers

We have had such a great start to the school year. The children have come back with a really positive attitude to learning and old friendships are reconnecting and new friendships are being made.

I know that you want your children to have the best start to the year at school. Here are some ways I think definitely help:

- Meet your child's teacher informally or at the parent-teacher meeting next week. See below for details of how to book.
- Make sure they are getting into a good bedtime routine after a long summer of more flexible bedtimes.
- Closely monitor the time spent on digital media and the content of the media they are watching.
- Restrict social media use to children aged 13+.
- Send your child to school every day. Only keep them home when they are too unwell to be at school. It is also really important that children are at school for the start of the day. Aim to arrive at school between 8:30 and 8:45. (Did you know that being 30 minutes late to school everyday equates to about 20 days or 4 weeks of schooling missed?).
- Ask open ended questions about what they are learning at school and how they are feeling about school or friendships.
- Read with your children and help them learn their basic facts.
- Invite a friend over for a play date if they are struggling to make connections in their new class.
- Sign up for SeeSaw, the newsletter by email and Skool Loop to stay connected with what is happening at school. (Contact the office if you are unsure how to do this.)
- Encourage them to try new clubs or activities, at school and after school

 Come as a family to the Home and School Triathlon and sign your children up to participate. This will be a great community day.

Thank you for using the extended P2 drop off zone so well. This is really helping with traffic flow.

Parents/caregivers are welcome to drive up the school driveway before 7:45am and after 4:45pm. At all other times we need you to park in the street and walk up.

- enter your email address

You will be sent an email confirming your booking details. You will control your bookings and can make them to suit you, though like any system the earlier you book the more likely you will get what you want. Changing or cancelling your booking can be done at any time. The booking website will close at noon on each interview day. If you are not able to make a booking online, please phone the school office.

# **HALL FOR HIRE**

The school hall is now available for hire on Monday, Thursday and Friday evenings from 6 pm, Saturday afternoons and Sundays. If you know of a community group that are keen to hire the hall on a regular basis, please pass this information on. Further details can be obtained from the school office.

#### SCHOOL DONATIONS AND FEES

This year the donations and fees being requested are: School donation: \$290 per pupil (or \$72.50 each term). A tax credit of 33 cents in the dollar can be claimed from Inland Revenue for donations paid. Receipts are issued for all donations for this purpose.

<u>Technology consumables fee</u>: For Year 7 and 8's who attend the Plimmerton Technology Centre. The fee is \$70

and covers the costs of items brought home. It would be appreciated if this could be paid by the end of Term 1. Mathletics, Math Seeds and Reading Eggs: These fees are charged according to which class your child is in. Each programme costs \$22.

<u>Hapara</u>: This fee of \$7 is for a programme which enables the teachers to monitor all activity and aids keeping your children safe on their devices.

<u>Magazine fee</u>: This \$10 will show in your statement but is optional should you wish to receive a school magazine at year end.

At times there will be other fees on a user pays basis. Fees for activities such as chess, future problem solving club etc are only charged to those who enrol.

A statement requesting donations and fees is being issued to every family this week.

# Payments made to school

Our preferred method is via our school bank 12- 3140-0133108-01- we ask that all transactions are referenced with child's name and a description of what for e.g camp. We also have two boxes in the office - one solely for forms and the other for cash. It would be appreciated that any cash be in an envelope clearly named with a description of what it is for. We also have an EFTPOS machine at the office (no credit cards).
