Achievement Information on NCEA:

This week we received the Ministry of Education information on how our students performed in NCEA in 2015. Last year we had a number of students who left school without achieving Level 2 of the curriculum. In 2 cases they had achieved entry into Polytech courses and left school to earn money to support their studies this year. Both students are doing well. Three other students achieved excellence at Level 3 and are studying successfully at the Otago Polytech or at Otago University. Another student achieved well last year and is also studying successfully at Polytech. One student, who had done well studying agriculture, left school without Level 2 NCEA because of getting a job on a dairy farm. We are really disappointed that the percentage figures paint the school as doing poorly when the reality is we had outstanding students in Year 13 last year who excelled at school and have gone on to successful tertiary study.

We congratulate Reuben Pyle and Courtney Smith on their Class Act awards. We were proud to be represented by them at the award ceremony on Thursday and look forward to adding their photographs to the gallery of Class Act achievers.

- All of the Year 7 & 8 parents who helped set up, clean up, work in the lolly shop and cook the BBQ.


Hockey
