OUR BIKE TRACK



Everyone has been out using the track for bike training!!

Here are the expectations our children came up with...

- Line up nicely
- Check your helmet is tight
- Wait 10 seconds for Piwaiwaka
- Wait 5 seconds for Tui and Kereru whanau
- Two hands on the bike at all times.
- Be aware of uneven surfaces
- Be aware of obstacles and kids playing around them
- Slow down on the bump track
- Kids on the playground look before you cross the bike track
- Show manaakitanga when returning the bikes back

CYCLE/SCOOTER DECLARATION FOR

The above named rider has agreed to the following terms and conditions

- The rider will wear at all times an Australian/NZ standards approved helmet, which is well maintained and pertains to the required standards.
- The helmet will be adjusted correctly and securely fastened.
- The bicycle/scooter will be stored in a designated area for bicycles/scooters.
- The student, parent/caregiver will provide a lock for the bicycle/scooter.
- The rider will take responsibility for locking and securing their bike/scooter
- The student, parent/caregiver will maintain the bike in accordance with the current NZ bike code and the bike will be ridden according to the road rules.
- The student, parent/caregiver will maintain the scooter in a safe, working condition and the scooter will be ridden in a manner consistent with the NZ Transport Agency Scooter Safety Guidelines.
- Bikes/scooters will be walked in/out of the school grounds and across the pedestrian crossing/road patrols.
- The Principal reserves the right to revoke the privilege to ride to/from school if deemed necessary.

POLICY STATEMENT- ROAD SAFETY

Rationale

Road Safety is an aspect of the children's education, which is a shared responsibility between the school and the parents/caregivers.

Purpose:


- To inform and educate all children on aspects of road safety pertaining to their safe travel to and from school.
- To educate children in safe and considerate conduct and safe behaviour when on school buses.
- To inform parents/caregivers of safe carriage of children to and from school trips.
- To encourage Police Education Officer visits to reinforce safety procedures.

Conclusion

Road safety skills and procedures are a lifetime necessity, which we at Mangere Bridge School can help to establish firmly at an early age, for the present and future benefit of our children and the community.

GUIDELINES FOR CYCLE/SCOOTER RIDERS AT MANGERE BRIDGE SCHOOL

- NZ Police, Bike Wise and the LTSA recommend that cyclists should be a minimum of 10 years old.
- An Australian/New Zealand standards cycle helmet must be worn at all times (providing it has been well maintained and pertains to the required standards)
- · The helmet must be adjusted correctly and securely fastened
- All bicycles/scooters must be walked in/out of the school grounds and across the pedestrian crossing
- · Bicycles/scooters must be stored in the racks adjacent to Pikitia
- · Children are responsible for providing and using a lock to secure the bike/scooter
- Parents/Caregivers and children are responsible for maintaining the bike in a safe working condition
- Parents/Caregivers and children are responsible for maintaining the bicycle in accordance with the current NZ bike code
- Children must seek parental/caregiver and Principal written permission prior to riding to and from school
- The Principal has the right to revoke the privilege of riding to and from school if deemed necessary.
- You need to agree to the rules by both you and your parent signing the form
- Return the signed form to the office
- Your bike licence will be printed out at the office, signed by the principal, laminated and returned to you within the week

POLICY REVIEW

Currently under review is the following policy..

Alcohol/Drugs and Other Harmful Substances

Mangere Bridge School is committed to a safe and healthy environment for students and staff. This policy refers to alcohol, illegal drugs, prescription and non-prescription drugs, mind altering substances, psychoactive substances (such as legal highs, party pills, synthetic cannabis, etc), solvents, and other harmful substances.

Prescription and non-prescription medicine required at school by students is managed under the school's <u>Medicines</u> procedure and/or <u>Asthma</u> policy. Students or staff using medication that may impair their ability to function normally should not be at school.

It is not acceptable for students to be in possession of, supply, consume, or be under the influence of alcohol, illegal drugs, prescription and non-prescription drugs, mind altering substances, legal highs, solvents, and other harmful substances on school premises, or while travelling to and from school, or while taking part in any activity organised by the school or on behalf of the school.

Staff will not be in possession of, consume, or be under the influence of illegal drugs, mind altering substances, legal highs, solvents, and other harmful substances on school property, or at any time when they have responsibility for students, including EOTC activities.

Staff will not consume or be under the influence of alcohol, when the school is open for instruction or they have responsibility for students, including EOTC activities. See <u>EOTC Supervision</u>.

Other adults supervising students taking part in any activity organised by, or on behalf of, the school are also bound by this policy.

Mangere Bridge School is a <u>smoke free</u> school. Smoking is not allowed anywhere on the school grounds at any time. School activities away from school such as EOTC or sports trips are also smokefree.

HEALTH RELATED

Health Notice - School Sores (Impetigo)

Impetigo (School sores) usually starts as little blisters. These then break and start to weep, usually pus, and sometimes clear liquid. The weeping patches tend to grow larger. Yellow or brownish scabs then form which can burn or itch.

Impetigo can also start as any lesion (bite, damaged skin) that doesn't heal and develops a crusty scab. Sometimes it looks like a rash— which may begin as a single spot, but if a person scratches, it may spread to other areas. Impetigo can be spread to other people by contact with the sores. The sores are most infectious when there is weeping or crusting.

As soon as you think your child might have impetigo, take them to the doctor. Treatment will depend on how severe the infection is. The doctor may prescribe a course of antibiotic tablets. These are usually taken over seven days. Antibiotic creams and ointment are sometimes used. If the child does not get better with treatment or if the sores return, contact your doctor, as you may need a different treatment or further investigation into the cause. More severe cases may require antibiotics, taken by mouth. Dry sores do not need to be enclosed but weeping sores should be

Impetigo is very contagious. Follow your doctor's advice about when the child can return to school.

washed and kept covered (dressed).

Reduce food waste

The average New Zealand family throws away around \$560 worth of uneaten food every year *.
Here are some simple ideas to reduce food waste in your home.

- Plan your meals and make a shopping list.
- Rotate items when unpacking your groceries, older in front and newer products behind.
- Store bread and meat in the freezer to extend their life.
- **Keep** food fresh and safe by storing in the fridge below 5°C so food lasts longer.
- **Use** leftover cooked vegetables in a frittata or soup or take as your lunch.
- Use brown bananas in baking or freeze for smoothies. Wilted vegetables are great in soups.
- Save leftover fruit from your child's lunchbox and give it to them for afternoon tea.

Engage Your Brain

Te Iti Kahurangi - Kāhui Ako are proud to announce that host of the documentary "All in the Mind", and co-host of the TV Series "The Secret life of Girls", Nathan Wallis, Aotearoa's renowned neuroscience educator, is coming to our community with his talk - Engage Your Brain.

This talk focuses on the social/emotional aspects of your brain development - how feeling impacts our thinking. While the times that this brain really has the steering wheel is 2-8 and again in the middle of adolescence, it is relevant to all learners that want to feel engaged, enthusiastic and passionate about what they do. The fundamental mistake New Zealand society has made over the last few decades, is thinking that a two-year-old is a little seven-year-old and that the earlier we get ready to be seven, by learning numeracy and literacy, the better off we will be. That's just not how our brain develops. A large part of intelligence is problem-solving and problem-solving is hugely dependent on creativity. Creatively largely comes online, between the ages of two and seven, in a free-play, child-lead environment. Its development is inhibited if we focus instead on seven-year-old formalised literacy and numeracy. Learning is so much easier when the learner is engaged.
