A Note from the Principal

Lock Down

We will be practising our school Lockdown procedures with children again in the near future. We believe we do have robust policy, guidelines and procedures but are presently reviewing them in light of what happened in Christchurch. The police are also working with schools on this. One change we have made is for children, at all times (including recess), to return to their own Hubs/classrooms instead of going to the nearest building. In Christchurch this proved to be problematic when children did not return to their own class with their own teacher/s.

The police have alerted to us that the biggest issue in Christchurch lockdowns was with parents trying to enter the school to get their children. This is understandable from a parent perspective but cannot be allowed by the police or the school. The school can only release children to their parent when the Lockdown has officially ended. We know now that this could last for a number of hours. This is why it is essential that the school office has updated contact numbers for all parents. In case of an emergency here at school we will notify parents directly by text or phone.

Truancy and Lateness

It is vital that children are here for the start of each day. Children need time to settle for the day. Arriving after the bell can cause disruption and unfortunately for some of our children this is a regular occurance. As adults we may not think that this is an issue but from a child's perspective a child might feel that they are not sure of what to do when all the other children do.

It is illegal for children to be truant (not at school without a medical reason) and constantly late. We will be notifying the school's Truancy Officer if this is a continuing issue for any of our children. If for any reason your child arrives after 8.55am, they **must** report to the office. After the attendance register has been completed for the morning by the teacher (and again in the afternoon) a child could be marked absent if the register is not altered by office staff.

Communication

There are still several families who have not provided us with their email address. Because our information for home is now digital there is a risk that some whanau will not have accessed our newsletters and communications. This term we have provided a number of paper newsnotes but these will become less and less. We do have a Notice Board in the office foyer, so if in doubt, please check this for all the latest news. Newsletters are always available through our school Website. All notices, newsletters and local school/community related news are always put on the school Facebook.

Healthy Easter Egg Pops

Ingredients

- 500g low fat yoghurt
- · Handful natural muesli
- Handful of diced fresh, frozen or dried fruit - (e.g. bananas, blueberries, sultanas)

Instructions

- In ice block moulds, layer the fruit, yoghurt and muesli until each mould is full
- 2. Place a stick into each ice block mould
- 3. Freeze and serve when required.
