Every state and state integrated school in New Zealand is currently undergoing a trustee election process.

At our school we are looking for **FIVE** community trustees. Parents, caregivers and people from the wider community can put their name forward to be on a school board during the board of trustee elections.

What is a school board of trustees?

Almost all state and state integrated schools in New Zealand have a board of trustees. School board membership includes parent representatives, a staff representative and the principal.

What do trustees do?

Trustees on a school board of trustees work together to make sure every child/ tamariki reaches their highest possible standard in educational achievement. As part of that key responsibility, here are some of the things boards do:

• Work with the principal and consult with staff, students and the community

- Set the educational goals and strategic direction of the school
- Monitor progress and let parents know how the school is progressing against its annual targets and how well students are achieving
- Decide how the school's funding will be spent
- Support the school's principal and support the development of all staff
- Oversee the management of staff, property, finances, curriculum and administration.

• Ensures that the educational needs and aspirations of Maori learners, Pasifika learners and learners with special learning and behaviour needs are identified, planned for and met.

• Fulfils the intent of the Treaty of Waitangi by valuing and reflecting New Zealand's dual cultural heritage.

• Appoints the principal and assesses their performance.

What skills do trustees need?

Trustees are active leaders in their schools and need to work well in a team, ask challenging questions and have good communications skills. Boards need a balance of skills and experiences around the table to ensure effective processes for planning, monitoring, reporting and reviewing of the school's performance are in place.

What help do school trustees get?

HOMEWORK POLICY

Thank you for your recent feedback on Homework at Papakowhai School. The Homework policy has now been updated.

Homework should supplement classroom learning and give teachers an opportunity to establish positive learning links with the home.

Be sufficiently flexible to be responsive to the needs of the learner

GUIDELINES

- 1. It is expected that all children at Papakowhai School will complete homework.
- 2. Teachers will be responsible for setting the homework and for checking it that it has been completed weekly or fortnightly.
- 3. If there is no homework set for a particular week, teachers should notify parents in writing.
- 4. Parents should notify the teacher if their child is unable to complete homework.
- 5. No child should be required to work longer than 30 minutes daily on homework.
- 6. If children do not complete their homework teachers will communicate this with the parents. There will be no other consequence or requirement to complete homework during break times.
- 7. Regular reading at home is the main activity for homework.

All students will:

- Read for 10-30 minutes, 4-5 times per week.
 - o This can include reading silently
 - $\circ~$ Reading to an adult
 - $\circ~$ Being read to.
- Keep a reading log signed by parent or caregiver and return it to school for checking.
- Have the option to do online tasks such as Reading Eggs or Mathletics
- Have the option to do home based learning tasks
