

A pulley is on a well. The well has a bucket, the bucket is attached to a piece of string, you put the bucket down and use the string and the pulley to get it up or down. A wheel and axle is a pair of scissors which you use to cut things. The axle part is the sharp part and the wheel is the round circle on it. They all have a meaning. We use a machine everyday.
