Curriculum

Last week we spoke about the Central Idea (CI) and this week we will discuss the Lines of Inquiry. As the Central Idea is very wide and general we then narrow the focus of the unit using Lines of Inquiry. These are short statements which directs our learning and allows us to build critical skills. Below are some important points to know about Lines of Inquiry:

- They narrow the focus of the inquiry and allow us to inquire using a conceptual lens
- We look at each line using a Key concept to help unpack the line of inquiry
- There are 8 key concepts (Form, Function, Causation, Connection, Change, Responsibility, Reflection and Perspective).
- Each unit will focus on 3 Key Concepts and we will have all 8 covered by the end of the year.


