### Happening in Our School...

#### **School Closure Days**

A few of our children arrived for school on Teacher-Only Day, despite the <u>numerous</u> reminders which had been sent out over a period of time via a range of methods, including: school newsletter term dates, upcoming events, articles and banner heading, Skool Loop app, website front page, reminder emails, class teachers' verbal reminders to children and parents, as well as our school's Facebook page. The situation was further compounded by at least two families who were unreachable via their emergency numbers.

It is <u>every parent's responsibility</u> to ensure that they use <u>at least one</u> of these communication systems to regularly check-in on school events AND that they can be contacted **AT ALL TIMES** during school hours, particularly if we have an actual emergency to deal with. In times when you may have no money on your phone, you need to have a way where you can be contacted.

The board will also be undertaking a whole school emergency evacuation drill later this year to test that all students can indeed be safely evacuated.

#### **Board of Trustees Election News**

Congratulations to our successful candidates, all of whom were re-elected unopposed. Thank you to our community who recognise the great work that this team has undertaken over the last 3 years in their governance role.

#### **Teacher-Only Day**

Starting at 8am, our teachers undertook a comprehensive review of some very BIG PICTURE topics pertaining to our school and its curriculum. They used this day to:

**Reflect** on Rewa Rewa School's curriculum, school practices and learning partnerships — the key areas that we have identified for ongoing development include:

- Learner agency, including student voice we want our children to be thinking critically and talking about how and what they are learning
- Teacher inquiry into best practice continuing to promote innovative, well-researched programmes and strategies that support learner outcomes
- Developing effective partnerships with parents & our community to support our learners

**Evaluation Indicators** – we reviewed our current practice against key indicators (all 35 pages of them!), in preparation for our next ERO review, due this year. The new board will undertake a similar exercise this term.

The MOE has produced a series called **Local Curriculum** (Local Curriculum / Assessment / Community Partnerships), to guide schools in their review of how they can be more effective.
