Early on in Term 1 of this year, after the school leaders were elected and we started meeting as a school council, one of the first tasks I asked them to take on was to develop more coherent school values. We agreed that we liked the longstanding ones: Caring, Confident, Enthusiastic, Respect, Proud, Responsible, Curious; but we found it difficult to remember them. Therefore, I suggested we have a word to 'hang' our values off that would trigger our memory. We were essentially looking for a clever acronym. After several meetings, they decided on "COURAGE" as the core value to base the others around. They then brainstormed in pairs, or on their own and developed a range of options for each of the letters of courage. We wanted to keep some of the old values, so they decided to keep Confident, Respectful and Enthusiastic. With the leadership council being stuck on whether "Adventurous" or "Ambitious" was better, or "Grateful" or "Grit" would be more appropriate; I surveyed the teachers for a final cut. So, that is the story of how we've ended up with our core School Values:

Enthusiastic

These will be taught in lessons over the year. We want our Waikite Valley learners

to be strong in all of these values and we aspire to have them as they will be the foundation of our school culture.



UNIFORM SURVEY FINDINGS

Thank you to all the families who returned the paper surveys to the office or posted an indicative vote on the Facebook Page. The uniform debate has valid pro's and con's - with strong opinions often being

voiced. It is really important that we each have the opportunity to voice our opinions or views, but that we also understand that we have different reasons and experiences that lead to our decisions. As a community it is clear that there is polarized thinking around whether or not Waikite Valley School needs a uniform. Through receiving the surveys and looking at the outcome of the votes, it is clear that we have not reached the point where a uniform is a need for our students and their families.

Some points made on the paper surveys were:

"We just moved here, if the school had a uniform that would have been another expense that we would have found hard to come up with"

"I like the hoodies and puffers as an option, but not compulsory. Perhaps we could offer a T-Shirt for summer along the same lines. School pride is awesome, but I don't think it needs to be compulsory every day."

"As there are great hoodies and jackets already, I think a polo/fleece would look very smart for our school grounds."

"I don't mind either way. No clothing battles at home yet. I think a uniform would look nice and smart".
