Ramadan and Eid

During Eid, people say "Eid Mubarak" which is a greeting to bless everyone and their Eid. The muslim tradition for fasting for 30 days is called Ramadan. It is a celebration muslim people do to reading the first part of the Quran. During Ramadan we do not eat between sunrise and sunset but we eat early in the morning and late at night so we don't die. Eid is a festival for muslims where we celebrate ending our fast. Eid starts when you see a little bit of the moon. On the day you see the moon, the next day you go to different houses for one day and then another day you host people to your house. All the adults give children money during Eid. We have lots of different yummy foods to celebrate like vegetables, chicken, and lamb samosas. We have traditional food like coconut ice balls, nimkis, hundreds and thousands balls and soa (which is a small chunk). In the morning we go to Mosque and we wear long robes called Kamis. They have designs in black, red, dark yellow or grey. There is no bright colours on Kamis. Sometimes we wear round hats. In the afternoon when people come to our houses we wear traditional tops and pants.
