During this term we are focussing on building resilience in our students. We have noticed that this is an issue currently. We are pairing this with our value of empathy.

RESILIENCE

Resilience is defined as the ability to recover quickly from difficulties or challenging situations.

Resilience is not a trait that people either have or do not have. It involves behaviours, thoughts and actions that can be learned and developed in anyone.

Resiliency is not one specific thing, but a combination of skills and positive attributes that people gain from their life experiences and relationships. These attributes help them solve problems, cope with challenges and bounce back from disappointments.

Personal resiliency is about our assets – the resources, attributes and skills that help us recover from negative events or feelings, cope with challenges and adversity, and look after ourselves when things aren't going well.

GROWTH MINDSETS

The work we are doing in visible learning around growth mindsets and allowing ourselves to be in the 'pit' are important in building resilience. We all know that life often doesn't go the way we planned and developing the skills to cope with adversity and challenge early, are really important and assist children when facing difficulties with their learning. We want our students to know that having a growth mindset will help them with their learning.

With a fixed mindset, there's a strong desire to always appear 'smart' which leads to a tendency to...

- ...avoid challenges
- ...consider effort as useless
- ...regard feedback as though something was 'wrong' with the work.

With a growth mindset, there's a strong desire to learn, which leads to a tendency to...

- ...embrace challenges
- ...see effort as the pathway forward ...welcome feedback to improve.


