DISCO FEVER

What a fantastic night at the Disco. Over 350 children danced the night away and loved purchasing the merchandise! Thank you to Kirsty Everett and all the Home and School Team and volunteers who made it such a great night. I really appreciate the way the community enables great events like this for the children.

READATHON

We are nearing the end of our Readathon month. If you need a new Readathon booklet please call into or email the office (office@papakowhai.school.nz). I am encouraged to hear about kids who have really got into reading this month, challenging themselves to read more and have been trying new types of books. There is a prize for the child in each class who has read the most over the month of June. In the last week of term, we need you to return the signed Readathon booklets to the classroom teacher. <u>The prizes for the best readers will be based on booklets</u> <u>returned before Friday 5 July</u>.

Sponsorship money should be returned to the School Office by Friday 5 July. There will be a prize for the class that raises the most money (averaged over the number of children in each class). If you can pay the sponsorship money by internet banking that would make Heather's job so much easier. Our bank account number is 12-3140-0133108-01. There are still 10 days in June, it is not too late to start reading!

BIKE TRACK

The fundraising from the Readathon will contribute to the installation of a bike track at Papakowhai School. In 2018 the BOT identified the lack of all-weather play space at Papakowhai School.

Our school of 500 students has one netball court, a tennis court sized AstroTurf, three small courtyards, a small basketball area and three playgrounds when the grass is closed. This contributes to lower well-being for staff and students during the winter months, including more playground upsets and frustration at the lack of play space. Our health and safety records show a spike in injuries when there is less play space available.

The BOT committed to funding up to \$34,000 for a 1.5m concrete track. Concrete was chosen for durability, less need for ongoing maintenance and the fact that scooters could also use the path.

Earlier this month Bikes in Schools made a donation of \$40,000 to further enhance our bike track project. This means we can include a fleet of 40 -50 school bikes (and a storage solution) as part of our project, we can widen the main riding track to 2m track and include a small challenge area (basically dirt track bumps) in the corner of the field.

The track will skirt the perimeter of the field so it will not impact on other sports. This is going to be a tremendous asset to the school and the community.

MATARIKI CELEBRATION 2019

As part of our commitment as Tangata Whenua of Aotearoa, Papakowhai School will acknowledge Matariki by having an early morning celebration at school on Friday 28th June. Matariki signals the Māori New Year. It is a time of renewal and celebration in New Zealand that begins with the rising of the Matariki star cluster (the Pleiades or Seven Sisters).

The outline for the Matariki Celebration is as follows:

7.00am: Students and Whanau arrive and gather on court between Totara and Kauri

7.15am: Walk up the rainbow to watch the stars and sing Matariki song

7.30am: Kapa haka perform on Totara deck

7.45am: Karakia kai

7.50am: Breakfast (this will be provided)

8.25am: Breakfast concludes, Whānau and students are free to head off.

In preparation for our Matariki celebration classes have been learning the Matariki song. In addition to this, students will have the opportunity to make lanterns that

they can bring along to the celebration.

We'd like to thank everyone for making this year's disco another successful event for our students. We're always looking to make these events better and this year we introduced some new ways of doing things. Whenever new systems are implemented there can be some wrinkles and we appreciate the patience shown from the junior disco parents. As you know we are using Kindo to help manage events and we pre-sold 337 tickets this way which was amazing. That, combined with door sales, meant that over 350 students came to the two discos. That's a fantastic turnout! We know parents understand that with that number of students trying to get into the hall there are always delays, however this year at the junior disco they were longer than expected for which we apologise.

This first use of Kindo was a learning experience for us and parents, e.g. we all learnt how important it is to have the correct classroom listed for a child. This year we also introduced a cashless system where students bought tickets to use at the various tables. The feedback we had



was very positive which was great, as it was simpler for students, parents, and disco helpers. We plan to change some things from this year's event which we know will make future events run more smoothly.

We will be using the Kindo cashless based system for both the calendar art in Term 3 and the end of year BBQ in Term 4 so, if you haven't registered or need to check your children's details are correct, now is a great time to do so. A big thank you to Kirsty Everett and Cherie Phelps for taking the lead on the disco and to all the parent and whanau helpers on the night for making this another fantastic night that our children enjoyed.
