Dear Parents/Caregivers

MATARIKI

Papakowhai School will acknowledge Matariki by having an early morning celebration at school on **Friday, 28th June, at 7am** on the Totara/Kauri court. Matariki signals the Māori New Year. It is a time of renewal and celebration in New Zealand that begins with the rising of the Matariki star cluster (the Pleiades or Seven Sisters).

There is NO Before School Care on Friday 28th June but your children are welcome to attend the Matariki Celebration from 7am. You are welcome to stay with your child or drop them off and go. There is NO CHARGE for BSC on Friday 28 June.

The morning will begin at 7.00am with everyone assembling on the Totara/Kauri court.

- 1. Matua Rangi will do an opening karakia and then will sing "Whakataka te hau" waiata
- 2. After the karakia and waiata we will make our way to the rainbow from Rimu side
- Once on the rainbow, a student will do a karanga, Matua Rangi will say a karakia and we will sing "E toru nga mea" waiata
- 4. After the waiata everyone will walk over the rainbow and down to the hall
- 5. Once in the hall Matua Rangi will say karakia kai
- 6. Students will collect their breakfast and find a seat on the floor and adults at tables

- 7. While everyone is eating breakfast a senior student will share the Matariki story with everyone
- 8. Kapa haka will perform a couple of waiata which will include the "Matariki" waiata
- 9. The morning will conclude with a closing karakia

REPORTS

Your child will receive their mid-year report on Monday 1st July. Please take time to read it with your child. Celebrate the good things together and talk over the next steps and how you can work together to achieve these.

This year we have provided your child's attendance as a percentage figure. I want you to notice:

- · If your child is attending **more than 95%** that's wonderful, it means your child has missed less than one week of school this year.
- · If your child has attended **more than 90%** that's pretty good, it means your child has missed less than two weeks of school this year.
- · If your child's attendance is **less than 90%** this is starting to be a concern; it means your child has missed more than two weeks of school this year.
- If your child's attendance is **80% or less** that is a concern, it means your child has missed 4 weeks or more of schooling this year.

We only provide one printed copy per child. We hope that in most cases you can share the report with other parents/caregivers. If your family circumstances require us to provide an additional copy please contact me and will provide an additional copy.

PARENT/TEACHER MEETINGS

These meetings will be held on Tuesday 2^{nd} and Thursday 4^{th} July from 3:15-8 pm.

This is an opportunity to review and reset goals, discuss your child's learning and well-being and clarify anything raised in the report or shared in SeeSaw.

How to update your child's details in Kindo

Caregivers can do this themselves by clicking on their child's name in the side bar & then selecting new rooms: Click on child's name in side bar:



Select correct room number from the drop down that appears:



If parents are signing in on a laptop or computer, the child's name will appear on the left hand side when they click into an event.

If they are signing in on a smart phone, then they will need to click on the 3 lines on the left hand side after first clicking on an event.

INFLUENZA OUTBREAKS

Regional Public Health have notified us that several schools and early child education centres (ECCs) in the greater Wellington region have had influenza outbreaks. Influenza (flu) is a virus that spreads quickly from person to person through the air by coughing and sneezing as well as by hands, cups and other objects that have been in contact with an infected person's mouth or nose.

The main symptoms of flu are fever, coughing and sometimes vomiting or diarrhoea in younger children. If your child is ill with flu, please advise the school and keep them at home until they are feeling well and are symptom free (usually between 3 – 7 days). Children should also avoid sporting or social events so that they don't spread the illness to others.

It is important to make sure everyone covers their mouth and nose with tissues when coughing or sneezing and to regularly wash and dry their hands. There are good tips for looking after people with the flu www.rph.org.nz/influenza
