When dealing with a behaviour issue or a conflict we have been aiming to use a positive approach while at the same time, still having consequences if they are needed. The focus is on taking responsibility for the behaviour, putting things right and then moving forward.

When participating in restorative chats we use the following steps:

- 1. What happened? (Tell the story)
- 2. Who do you think has been affected? (Explore the harm)
- 3. What do you need to do to put things right? (Repair the harm)
- 4. How do we make sure this doesn't happen again? (Move forward)


