NZ AREA SCHOOL TOURNAMENT

In the first week of the July holidays, I had the pleasure of travelling, and staying, with eight of our Maniototo Area School students (Danielle Mapley, Aroha Cromb, Tyla Spooner, Harmony Devitt, Doug Smith, Damian Carson, Te Ariki Tapatu & Andrew Fetalver) who were selected to represent the South of the South at the NZ Area School's Tournament in Rotorua.



After a hectic six weeks of fundraising, we left early Sunday morning to fly to Rotorua, via Wellington. For one of our students it was their first time flying!

We arrived at Rotorua and settled in to our accommodation at Rotorua Boys High. Most of the sporting codes had a get-together to re-learn names, rekindle friendships and practice together before Monday's start. This is the strength of the "South" as most of our students know each other from previous tournaments, weekend sport or school formals.

Over the following week our students competed in netball, rugby, volleyball, basketball, football and ki o rahi. Every one of them showed our school PRIDE values of Participation, Respect, Integrity, Determination and Empathy, whether on or off the field.

Each day the students played against each different region: Monday was South v's Central (bottom of the North Island Area Schools); Tuesday was South v's North (top of the North Island Area Schools) and Wednesday, the big competition of Top of the South Island v's the Bottom of the South Island - Us!

Students were viewed for selection for South Island teams and then Thursday was the big clash of the islands.

Five of our students succeeded in gaining selection for South Island teams. Danielle Mapley (football) Harmony Devitt (netball B) and Doug Smith, Damian Carson and Te Ariki Tapatu (rugby). These North versus South games are fiercely contested and our students gave their all.

From these games, and over the week, a New Zealand Area School team is chosen for each of the sports. Doug Smith was selected for the NZ Barbarians Area Schools Rugby team and named as Vice Captain for this team. He will travel to Palmerston North on 10th September and stay at the Massey University Sport & Rugby Institute during the 4 days of training. They have a training game on Wednesday and then on Saturday 14th September they play a game against a Manawatu age group representative team before returning home.

Although we were a small team from the South all our students represented our areas, our communities, families and themselves with huge heart and determination. This was demonstrated more than ever in the rugby team. These boys won the overall regional clash for the first time and the cheer from the all the teams, at presentations, was one of huge respect for our small region. It is here that I would like to thank Philip and Donna Smith for their support/coaching/managing the rugby at this tournament and their help with fundraising to get the children to Rotorua (and home!).

Thanks to all the community businesses, community groups and families who supported these students to get to Rotorua. Without your help in buying tickets or donating goods, we would never have got there.

Many thanks to the students who made our school, community and families proud. You were amazing young people who were a credit and pleasure to be with.
