Board News

Māori Success as Learners

Board members and principals attended an NZSTA hui at Newlands College last week to learn about the latest Ministry initiative - "Hautū"- an assessment tool to help us understand how culturally responsive our school is for Māori and how we can work together to identify priorities for development in supporting our Māori learners to succeed. Our Board will confirm a date for a hui in the near future for anyone who would like to attend, so that we can identify what success for Māori looks like at Rewa Rewa School and 'where to' next. We would like to believe that what we identify will work for Māori, will also be of benefit to other individuals or groups.

Mid-Year Data

At this time each year, the Board is presented with school-wide mid-year data in Reading, Writing and Maths. This information informs the Board as to how our students are progressing and achieving, so that we can put timely measures into place, such as funding for additional support. Overall, we believe most of our students are on track to meet their expected curriculum achievement levels. Our parent community will have seen that there have also been updates to both the format and content of our written student reports. Thank you to all those who have taken the time to complete the survey with regard to these changes. We will use your voice to help us to continue to refine these.

Community Emergency Evacuation

The Principal and DP attended this course, run by the WCC Civil Emergency Team, as we are reviewing our current emergency systems and procedures. It was interesting to listen to those who were in Christchurch for the 2011 earthquake and the recent mosque shootings. Several key areas have come out of these events for us to think about, the most important: how will we manage effective communication immediately after the event, how well prepared are we if parents/ caregivers cannot pick up their children and do we have enough emergency supplies to last until parents/ caregivers arrive. Over the next term we will be updating and informing our community of our key responses to these issues. If there are any parents who have expertise in this area (e.g. creating informative fliers, fridge magnets etc.), and would like to work on a sub-committee to develop these, we would love to hear from you. We will be holding a whole-school emergency evacuation drill on Friday 25 October (prior to Labour weekend), to test our reunification procedures in the event of an emergency.

Learning Co-ordinator Support

Our Newlands cluster was one of very few among Wellington schools to be included in the first rollout of schools to be supported by this new Ministry initiative. The purpose of this resourcing is to enable schools to better access agencies to support students and their whanau. How this will look in reality is still to be explained to communities and there is debate in educational circles about the equity of such a scheme, with so many schools having to wait for their turn – watch this space!

School Website

Remember to have a look at our newly renovated website. The Board has just approved an upgrade to the latest website platform, this will enable translation of all information on our site – including forms and newsletters/notices - into any of 104 different languages. The Board recognises that we have a very diverse community with speakers of at least 15 different languages. Our hope is that this upgrade will enable better communication with families at our school, as well as those looking at prospective enrolment.

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Play-Based Learning

Our junior team is working hard alongside the Board to develop an outside play area that supports their Learning through Play programme. If you have expertise and experience in construction, grant applications and painting, we would love to hear from you. Fencing and concrete paths will be the first stage towards this exciting new venture.
