


DIGITAL LEARNING IN HIBISCUS




WHAT NOW


If your child is absent we really appreciate it when you contact the office to let us know.

Chicken pox

This notice is to inform you that we have quite a few students who have contracted chicken pox. Chicken pox is a very contagious virus. It is spread through the air by infected people when they sneeze or cough, and by touching the chickenpox blisters and then touching objects or other people. Chickenpox is contagious from five days before the blisters appear. It stays contagious until all the blisters have crusted over and no new ones are appearing. During this time, we ask you to keep your child home from school.
