FROM FATHER MATT...

The Maternity of Mary – Mother of the Church.

Recently, I had someone criticise the emphasis that the Church places on Our Lady. This comment was quite strange. I reminded this person of the words of Holy Scripture that explain clearly, 'From this day forward all generations will call [Mary] me Blessed' (Lk. 1:48) and that we don't honour the Son by ignoring the mother or rejecting the Sacred Texts. The crux (I think) of understanding Mary and her place in the Church is to understand her motherhood, so I thought I would shed a few thoughts on Mary's motherhood.

Mary is the Mother of Christ who is God. Thus she is the Mother of God. If we belong to the Church she is also our mother. Pope Paul VI explained: "Therefore, for the glory of the Blessed Virgin and our consolation, we declare most Holy Mary [to be] Mother of the Church, that is Mother of the whole Christian people, both faithful and pastors, who call her a most loving Mother; and we decree that henceforth the whole Christian people should by this sweet name, give still greater honour to the Mother of God and address prayers to her."

To see the importance of this maternal role of Our Lady we need look no further than Sacred Scripture. The spiritual maternity of Mary is seen nowhere better than at the crucifixion in the Gospel of John. In using the words, "Woman, behold your son" (John 19:26), Jesus proclaims Mary's motherhood not only of John but of every Christian. The book of Revelation also provides further testimony to the maternity of Mary. Revelation 12:1-2 concerns a woman giving birth. "A woman clothed with the sun, with the moon under her feet, and on her head a crown of twelve stars; she was with child and she cried out in her pages of hirth, in anguish for



twelve stars; she was with child and she cried out in her pangs of birth, in anguish for delivery".

Thus the maternity of Mary is something alive and active. We ask her, our Mother, for help. Pope Leo XIII: No one is freed from evil, except through your help. Neither does anyone receive the divine gifts without benefit of your mediation. Apart from your Son, who is it that has more concern for the human race than you? Who protects us without fail when we are in trouble? Who frees us so rapidly from the temptations that befall us? Who seeks more earnestly to protect sinners? Who comes to their defence no matter how hopeless their situation? For these many reasons, the afflicted seek refuge in you. The very invocation of your name puts to flight the enemy and his servants. It is a safe refuge. You free those who invoke you from every need and you forewarn them against every temptation.
