Outdoor Learning Area:

Finally they have started on our outdoor learning area it is all marked out and just waiting for the digger to arrive and dig out the area for the concrete pad. Although the area is fenced off children <u>MUST NOT</u> go in to this area - especially once the builders actually start working.

<u>Swimming:</u>

Steve is busy getting our pool ready to start our swimming. If the weather is kind / warm enough we may start from next week, or the week after!

Cecille from **Swimming New Zealand** has been at school today going over some of the Water Skills for Life initiatives including -

- Briefly discuss safety at the beach (understanding waves and rips).
- River safety actively involved in dry mock rescues (using sticks as if in a river, understanding the importance of safety first, looking after themselves).
- Life jackets (the importance of lifejackets, getting students to fit them properly, HELP position, huddle).
- A variety of dry land exercises focusing on all muscles used in swimming, including survival skills.
- Scenario cards (breaking students into groups brainstorming survival strategies and how to keep themselves safe in various situations).

Once swimming starts students need to bring togs and towels each day, along with a plastic bag (or similar) to put their togs in to take home.

SCHOOL VAN CODE OF CONDUCT

As a passenger on an Aberfeldy School Van I agree to abide by the behavioural expectations described below:

- When I am a passenger, I will remain in my seat for the whole journey
- I will wear my seat belt at all times.
- I will not eat or drink in the van or throw anything inside or out of the van.
- I will respect other students and their property at all times (this includes pushing, verbal or physical abuse, or any other behaviour that may distract the Driver.
- I will use socially acceptable language when conversing with the driver and/or other students and I will not speak at a volume that may distract the driver.
- I will respect the property of the Van at all times (e.g. refrain from standing on seats or vandalising the vehicle in anyway).
- I will not engage in any behaviour that could put the driver or any other students at risk.
- I will observe the requirements and instructions of the Van Driver, the Principal and/or Van Committee at all times.
- I understand that any damage I cause to the Van will result in my caregiver being billed for the cost of repairs.

The Safety and comfort of everyone on the van depends on a standard of behaviour and consideration for others that is expected in the classroom. We hope that parents/ caregivers will support the school in maintaining these standards of behaviour.

If this Code of Contact is Broken:

- Students will be warned about their behaviour and given a chance to apologise.
- If there is still no improvement, travel on a school van will be withdrawn, and the caregiver will be required to find alternative transport to ensure they are meeting their legal obligation to get their child to school.
- In extreme cases of misbehaviour the privilege of travelling on a school van could be withdrawn immediately.

We appreciate parents and whanau support with upholding this Code of Conduct .

Also a reminder to PLEASE start up your van payments - \$20 per week for up to two children.
