
The word of the Lord



The introduction of 'Communities of Learning' or Kahui Ako's by the Ministry of Education has seen schools cluster together around common Achievement Challenges. The Waitomo Community of schools is called W.A.K.A. (Waitomo Arotahi Kahui



Ako). This WAKA has been operating now for three years in a collaborative way including all Waitomo Principals (11 schools) and Early Childhood Education Centres. Recently I was appointed (with permission to apply from the BOT) to the co-leaders role alongside Johan Van Deventer of Piopio College. There are two support principals that complete our leadership team Melissa Anderton (Te Kuiti Primary) and Kevin Ikin (Centennial Park). We meet every Thursday afternoon.

The Ministry provide staffing for the leaders to do the mahi and this is 0.2 FTTE. The Unions support Kahui Ako's as a pathway towards leadership for other staff members. For St Joseph's this means that each Thursday Mrs. Pip Were will lead the school in my absence.

The WAKA plan to rotate the leaders each year, for sustainability - and the two support principals would then take on the co-leadership along with two new supporting principals.


