Donations 2020

Our Board have agreed to accept the Ministry of Education's offer of funding to cover a number of areas that parents will not be asked to pay for next year.

Not all schools are able to accept this offer from the Ministry of Education.

Because we have accepted this offer parents/caregivers cannot be asked to pay for day trips, swimming, website subscriptions and anything that is part of the daily school curriculum.

Parents/caregivers will still be asked, and are expected to pay their children's stationery, school uniform, sports fees and any overnight camps.

We have asked for clarification about year 7/8 technology, which is in a slightly difficult area to understand and we will let parents know once we have some good answers from the Ministry.
