It has been another busy year of Horowhenua schools beginning to work collaboratively together to improve teaching and learning opportunities for our children across the whole region. There has been work in transitioning children from early childhood into school and from school to our colleges, in providing culturally responsive best practice and developing positive relationships between school and home and for the wellbeing of staff and students. One of the most effective successes has been in developing positive partnership relationships with our local iwi and I observe this going from strength-to-strength.

The Year That Was

Every year we aim to cover lots of experiences and programmes for our tamariki and sometimes we get there and sometimes we have to put things off for another year. We have had our fair share of staff, students and community illness and tangi for too many community members. Our thoughts and prayers remain with all those affected. And as usual these whanau and family realities are foremost in our minds and hearts at the time and appropriately where our energies and thoughts lie.

We have recently joined a Horowhenua Council initiative 'Enviro Schools' and we look forward to developing our school environment into a more enviro-friendly school. Our onsite 'House of Science' provides us with continuous science resources. We have improved our waste management, changed to more healthy food and are now a 'water only' school. We have had a number of exciting events throughout the year including: Celebrating 25 years of Bibles in Schools; Gumboot Day; an amazing Community Matariki celebration; 'Kids in the Kitchen' healthy lunch day where children received new lunch-boxes and water bottles; Zero Waste programme; Ag and Pet day; recently the Life Education caravan. There have also been art, speech and learning presentations and many of our diverse learners and Junior school visiting various local industries, including a group to the HMB Endeavour and Waka Haurua in Wellington.

Meet my amazing pet sheep, Carlton. Carlton is from the Bovidae family. He is an Ovis Aries.


Carlton is a huge, plump, woolly sheep. His face was cute, but now he is not cute he is handsome.



for adults.



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





