Value - Manaakitanga Social Skill - Respect

Do your children respect you?



Children aren't born with a built-in

sense of respect for others. All children need to be taught to be respectful. The best way to teach respect is to show respect. When a child experiences respect, they know what it feels like. Respect is an attitude. If children don't have respect for themselves or others, then it's almost impossible for them to succeed.

How can you show respect to your child?

- Your job is to be your child's parent, teacher, coach and limit-setter. This means teaching your child to behave respectfully to others and not just to you.
 Don't try to be your child's buddy or friend who lets them get away with everything.
- Model it. If you want your child to be respectful, you have to show them. Saying things like "we don't talk that way in this family" helps your child think about family values and how they are expected to treat others.
- Expect it. When your expectations are high, children will rise to it. Be clear with your child about what you expect from them in certain situations, and let them know what you expect from them.
- Teach it. It sounds old-fashioned, but it's very important to teach your child basic manners like

saying "please" and "thank you." These skills go a long way in your child's life.

 Praise it. When you see or hear your children being respectful, acknowledge it and praise them. Praise needs to be immediate.

It takes years to raise a respectful child and only moments to fill one with anger and disrespect. Which one would you rather choose?
