Special Character Clipboard:

Wednesday 26th February is Ash Wednesday.

This is a very important day of the year for Catholics. It marks the beginning of Lent, the 40 day preparation for Easter. Ash Wednesday is, traditionally, a "day of fasting and abstinence". This means the Church asks us to refrain from eating meat on this day and to eat less than we otherwise might. Lent is a time of penance when we try to make a little sacrifice and put God first in our daily lives. There are four ways the Church says we can do penance:

- 1. Give something up
- 2. Give money to the poor
- 3. Sacrifice our time for others, eq. volunteering for the Young Vinnies
- 4. Pray for a set purpose or time each day/week

We will be having a school prayer liturgy to mark Ash Wednesday.

At this, children receive a cross mark of ash on their foreheads. The following words are said,

"Turn to God & know that God loves you".

Thank you everyone for being willing and able to help.
