ABSENCES FROM SCHOOL

It is very important that the school office is informed when a child will be absent from school. The office staff are required to contact parents or caregivers when they are unaware of why a child is away. We are finding parents are sometimes advising teachers but this information does not always get passed onto the office, especially when there is a reliever in the classroom.

There are a number of options for advising the office - the dedicated 24 hour absence phone line (2338321), emailing the office, <u>office@papakowhai.school.nz</u>, calling the office directly, popping in when dropping other children etc. Please remember that if your child is unwell we do want them to stay home. Also if your child has been vomiting or had diarrhoea they need to stay home for 48 hours <u>after the last episode</u>.

OUT OF ZONE ENROLMENTS FOR 2021

Please contact Mark, <u>mark@papakowhai.school.nz</u>, before May 1st if you currently live <u>out of zone</u>, have children already attending Papakowhai School, you have a new entrant child who turns 5 in 2021 and you have not already completed an enrolment form for 2021.

If you are unclear about the boundaries of the school zone, please refer to our website. Please note all streets that are part of the "grandparenting clause" are counted as in –zone enrolments.

The number of out of zone places for 2021 for Year 1 siblings of current pupils will be determined by the Board of Trustees.

There will be no places for children who do not have a current sibling at school.

The process for this is as follows:

•Pre-enrolment of out of zone Year 1 children who have a sibling currently attending Papakowhai School will need to be received by May 1st, 2020.

•The BOT will determine from the pre-enrolments how many places are likely to be available in 2021 for out of zone Year 1 siblings of current students at the May meeting.

•The BOT will advertise the number of out of zone places and a ballot, if required, will take place before the end of Term 2.

SOCIAL SKILLS

At the moment we are focusing on our school Value of Manaakitanga and Friendship.



Learning to grow and develop strong friendships is an important life skill. It is up to us as parents and teachers, to teach children what that looks and sounds like. It is not a skill that children are naturally born with and needs to be taught within real-life contexts. Sometimes children find themselves in situations where they don't know how to behave. Learning to be a good friend involves listening, sharing, taking turns, being helpful, kind and dependable. When children interact with their friends, they learn many social skills such as how to communicate, co-operate and solve problems. At times our children struggle with friendships, which can be heart-breaking. Here are some ideas if your child is having some problems:

- Read some books about friendship
- Watch a good movie together about friendship
- Encourage play-dates with children in the same class or the same age, so they can practice friendship skills
- Get involved in activities after school or in the weekend sport, dance, art etc
- Let your child see you being a good friend
- Model correct reactions to different scenarios, showing them how to cope with problems. This teaches them how to handle difficult situations

As a parent, you play a crucial role in your child's social development. You can't make friends for your child but you can support them to make new friends. It's important that children are comfortable and happy with their friends at school. If you feel you need some support from your child's teacher as well, come and discuss it together so we can all support your child with this.
