#### HOME LEARNING TELEVISION

The Ministry of Education have been working to develop Home Learning TV | Papa Kāinga TV, on TVNZ.

You can find it on TVNZ channel 2+1 and on TVNZ on Demand, as well as on Sky Channel 502. It will run from 9am to 3pm on schooldays with programming for children and young people, as well as for parents.

Content will be grouped for early learners and students by age range, and will include play, literacy, mathematics, science, te reo Māori, physical education and wellbeing. All of the programmes will feature highly experienced teachers and presenters, along with wellbeing and movement experts.

daily programming information.Home Learning | Papa Kāinga TV will be on air for one month with provision to extend beyond that if needed.
