#### THANK YOU FOR YOUR FEEDBACK

Thank you for your feedback on the production. We are still working behind the scenes on how we can make this and other school wide events work in the shorter timeframe we have left this year. We are exploring alternate venues and ways to organise the production.

# **Production Planning**

What we want to achieve

A show that includes all Year 2-8 students. Students will participate in a class dance, there will be some massed singing and some senior students will be involved in drama.

We want there to be great costumes, lighting, sound, and a fun experience for the children and the audience.

We know that a show no longer than 90 minutes is best.

What we need

External support with choreography. We are just waiting to confirm availability with other dancing shows and exams on in the second half of the year.

A venue that can accommodate the children and the audience who want to attend in a comfortable way. We are relooking at our options for this. Our school hall is not a suitable venue.

What we can't do

Stage a production that includes all 450 Year 2 - 8 children in the same show.

Choreograph individual dances for all 16 Year 2 - 8 classes.

Split the school across multiple nights by surname so that all children in the same family can be in the same show. This would cause 10 weeks of disruption to classes as children went at different times to practices. Organisationally things work best when we organise dances in class groups.

# What we are not doing

We do not use the production as a fundraiser. Some of you have been surprised in the past by being charged \$20 per ticket. Typically, we make a \$2000 loss on the show by the time we pay for venue hire, lighting, sound, choreography costs, bussing children to the venue for practices, costuming and other incidental costs.

# So what's the current plan?

- Confirm a choreographer and venue by the end of June
- Split the Year 2- 8 classes into two groups so each show has eight classes performing
- Make a schedule to allow people to purchase as many tickets as they need at the lowest cost possible
- Aim to hold a show in November 2020
