SPECIAL CONSIDERATION FOR CLASS PLACEMENT 2021

In Term 4 we complete a thorough and thoughtful process to place students in classes for the following year.

Our goal is to create classes that:

- Are balanced with all types of learners in terms of learning needs, social needs and gender.
- Create a positive learning and social environment for all students, considering past experiences with peers and learning needs.

Communication is key, within our staff team and with parents. Class placement is a complex and time intensive challenge, so we are wanting to focus in our consultation on unique needs rather than preferences. For most families we need you to trust us that we will take care to place your child in a class that will meet their needs. Sometimes there are more significant issues that parents/caregiver's need to raise that may impact classroom placement.

We have a parent input process where parents/caregivers may submit a feedback form to share concerns or issues that may impact placement. This information will be kept confidential. The parent input process is not intended to offer the opportunity to request a specific teacher. Consideration will focus on the student need identified. To guarantee that your request informs the process we are using, please complete the following Google form <u>Class Placement Considerations for 2021</u> no later than Friday 13th November. If you cannot complete the form online, please contact the office and we will provide you with a paper copy.

Special considerations may be based on the following challenges:

- Social
- Learning
- Emotional
- Physical
- Past personal history with individuals (students or adults) that may substantially impact your child.

Requests for dealing with these special considerations should take the form of identifying:

- A teaching strength that may be needed to support your child
- A class level that would better meet your child's needs
- A peer that is requested as a positive support to directly address the special need
- A past experience that should not be repeated.

Examples of Special Considerations include, but are not limited to...

- Jeremy and Bruce had a lot of conflict this year and I request that they be separated next year.
- Jeremy has been identified with an anxiety and communication disorder and Wayne is a friend who really helps reduce anxiety and helps Jeremy focus on learning.
- In the past we had an issue with _____ and we would like to avoid repeating that experience.
- My child has ADHD and needs a teacher with clear structures in place in the classroom.
- My Year 7 child would be better suited to the Year 6/7 class to boost their confidence.
- My child has not had an existing friend placed in the same class for the last two years. Please consider placing my child with one of the following students...

Year 1 Information

- Year 1 children who have had three terms or less at school will be in Year 1 again in 2021.
- Children in Year 1 will not change teachers during the year.
- Rata 1 and 2 will fill up during Term 1 until they have approximately 16 children.
- A new class for new entrants will open in April.
- Another roll growth new entrant class will open in August.

Year 2 Information

- Children turning 6 before April 1 will progress to Year 2 in 2021. If you want your child to remain in Year 1 in 2021 please contact Lesley Hodge at <u>lesley@papakowhai.school.nz</u>.
- If your child turns 6 in April, Lesley will contact you to discuss your child's placement for 2021.
- Children turning 6 between 1 May and 1 July will stay in Year 1 in 2021. If you want your child to progress to Year 2 in 2021 please contact Lesley Hodge.
- Children turning 6 after 1 July will remain in Year 1.

Additional Information

- Class Organisation for 2021 is still subject to change.
- When we look at which Year 6's should stay in Totara and which Year 7's will move to Kauri we will look first at age, gender balance, then ability and friendship groups to determine the best place.

Digital Technologies - BYOD

- All Year 6 children can BYOD (Bring your own digital device).
- All Year 6 children will need to have a Chromebook if they are bringing their own device to school.
- Year 7 and 8 children have more flexibility in the type of device they choose.
- If you would like to discuss BYOD further, please contact Caine Webster at <u>caine@papakowhai.school.nz</u>.

• All Year 5 children will be provided with a school owned device so they can have one to one access in their classrooms.

- If you have <u>ordered and paid</u> then tickets will be issued from Monday 16 November

 If you have <u>ordered but not yet paid</u>, tickets will not be issued unless payment is received before Tuesday 10 November

- If you have <u>paid but are yet to complete the Google form</u> for ordering tickets, please do so.

It is very important that you reference your payment as 'Production' otherwise payments may be allocated elsewhere.

Remember tickets are limited so they are allocated on a 'first come first served' basis. If you haven't paid for your tickets by 10 November those tickets cannot be held.

A small gold band was found on school grounds. If you think it may be yours, please contact the office and describe it.


DONATING PRE-LOVED BICYCLES
