PAPAKOWHAI SCHOOL FUN RUN

It is nearly school cross country time and kids at almost every primary and intermediate school around New Zealand are getting their running shoes on, but research conducted by Sport NZ has found that one in four students aged 6 to 13 don't enjoy it.

While 73% like it, that's well below the enjoyment of playing with friends (99%), P.E. (94%) and club or school sport (92%). Sport NZ's research also found that enjoyment of school cross country declines as kids age: from 93% among 6-year-olds to 52% of 13-year-olds. Gender is also a factor, with boys significantly more likely to enjoy cross-country (80% compared to 65% of girls aged 6 to 13).

With this research in mind, we decided that now would be a good time to reflect on how Papakowhai School approaches cross country. A student survey, along with a video with how cross country could be more fun and engaging, was sent out to all classes. Responses and feedback from students was used to design the new and improved "Papakowhai School Fun Run"!

The purpose of the Papakowhai School Fun Run:

- whole school event
- being active
- having fun
- supporting one another
- being together to celebrate our successes

Fun Run outline:

When: Tuesday 13th April, beginning at 9.30am To encourage whanaungatanga students will complete the fun run in whānau groups. The older students will support our juniors to make the event inclusive. Each whānau group will have 30 minutes to complete the course as many times as they can. The course is the same as the traditional cross country course, but with a few obstacles and challenges along the way; including running through sprinklers, jumping over hay bales and through tyres, crawling under cargo nets and through tunnels, jumping on the big blue mat and through hopscotch games. Students will be encouraged to go at their own pace, but also to set a goal for themselves. Obstacles will be optional and can be easily bypassed as they go around the course. There is also an opportunity for students to run the course as fast as they can and as many times as they can.

Papakowhai School Cross Country:

When: Early to mid Term 2

Traditional competitive cross country still has a place in our school. We still encourage and embrace competition and there is a pathway for our Year 4 to 8 students to compete against other students in our region. Early in Term 2, Year 4 to 8 students will be invited to compete in traditional cross country races. From these events we will be selecting our team that will travel to Queen Elizabeth Park in Paekakariki to compete in the Parumoana cross country.

Separate letters will be sent home with more details about each of these events.
