READATHON



Papakōwhai School is holding a Readathon for the month of August. We are aiming to raise \$20,000 towards the cost of the amazing teaching assistants and librarians we have at our school. The cost of providing this level of support is close to \$400,000 per annum. About half of this is directly funded by the MOE and the remainder is funded through donations and hall hireage, and in recent years a surplus from running our after school care programme. With the current financial climate, reduced demand for after school care and other rising costs we need your support to continue to fund the current provision of teaching assistant support in our school.

All children in our school benefit from the work of our teaching assistants who run support programmes, help children one on one in class, work with extension programmes, help with English language learning and inspire our children to love reading.

Children need to keep a reading log throughout the month of August. If they fill out a reading log in their homework or communication book I would appreciate it if you could take a moment to fill in both logs.

You can choose how you want to sponsor.

- A set amount
- An amount per book read
- An amount per hour spent reading

We appreciate that there are lots of costs for parents, so we see this as an opportunity to share the sponsorship forms with grandparents, and wider whānau and friends.

There will be a prize for the top reader in each class and the class that raises the most money.

TAKING EXTRA CARE WHEN WAITING AFTER SCHOOL BY THE KINDERGARTEN

I have recently been told about problems after school on the Kindergarten grounds, behind the Kindergarten building and Kindergarten car park. Students are repeatedly entering the section behind the kindergarten, digging up the bank, throwing stones and sticks, and interfering with the discarded items they have there waiting for a skip bin. Kindergarten teachers frequently ask students to move off the property to the footpath but they return day after day.

Kindergarten teachers are having to regularly ask students to stop playing around the cars, chasing, kicking balls and throwing items, and ask whānau to move off the driveway so they can back cars out. There has even been damage to one of the cars.

Please take extra care if you are waiting for your children by the Kindergarten after school. Thank you.

SWIMMING TRIALS FOR TŌTARA AND KAURI (YEARS 5 - 8)

We will be holding our Parumoana Swimming trials on Tuesday 16th August at Cannons Creek Pool for our Year 5 - 8 students. Though trials are optional, we will be encouraging students to give it a go. Please have a conversation with your child at home if you would like them to take part.

Students can trial in 2 - 4 events. The events are:

Years 5 & 6: 25m freestyle, 25m backstroke, 25m butterfly and 25m breaststroke.

Years 7& 8: 50m freestyle, 50m backstroke, 25m butterfly and 25m breaststroke

Each Year group will have a boys and a girls team, made up of 4 or 5 students. The students selected will be the overall fastest swimmers

across the different strokes. By entering the trials, your child is committing to taking part in the Parumoana event if chosen for the team.

The KOS programme is jointly taught with NZ Police and officer Amy Price will attend the meeting to answer your questions. This programme is about children keeping themselves safe in all kinds of situations but there is a specific focus on preventing and reporting abuse.

Marsha Chiet is the Life Education educator and she will also be present. The Year 1 -2 children are focussing on Health Eating, Year 3-4 on the importance of physical activity, Year 5-6 on good decision making for reputation, identity and resilience, and the Year 7 and 8 programme is about substance.

NZEI CAMPAIGN

Kia ora Papakōwhai whānau,

This is a big year for the New Zealand Teachers Union NZEI, as we have recently started our new campaign Wāwāhi Tahā Time for Tamariki. You, our amazing community, were our biggest advocates and supporters during the 2019 campaign and we want to make sure that you are kept informed with what is happening for this campaign.

We took part in online paid union meetings in mid June. These meetings gave us a good sense of the issues under consideration and negotiations started with the government this month.

The last 2 and half years have not been the easiest, but by having a dedicated principal, amazing, hard working teachers and support staff and our very supportive and tight knit community, we have made it through. Thank you for your hard work in helping to support your

children's online learning from home, while working from home yourselves. We know it wasn't easy!

We are asking you to support our teachers in our new Wāwāhi Tahā Time for Tamariki campaign to ensure that your children continue to get the best possible education.

In this campaign we be negotiating with the government to:

- Address widespread understaffing
- Value and recognise teachers' work
- Enough time for teachers to complete their work during work hours
- Support for teachers working with high needs students
- Recognition of the importance of cultural skills
- Greater support for health & safety in schools
- Job security for relievers
