KEEPING OURSELVES SAFE

Harold the Giraffe is about to leave and the Police are arriving next week to help teach the Keeping Ourselves Safe programme. Keeping Ourselves Safe enables children to learn and apply a range of safety skills that they can use when interacting with others. Students recognise the differences between healthy and unhealthy relationships, and those who have been or are being abused are encouraged to seek help.

Key messages:

- Abuse is unacceptable and is a crime.
- Abuse can take a number of forms, all of which can be damaging to the victim.
- Abuse is never the victim's fault.
- No one deserves to be abused.
- Everyone in schools and the school community has a responsibility to help prevent the abuse of children.
- Students can be taught the skills, knowledge and attitudes that will help them recognise, avoid and report abuse.
- Reports of abuse must be listened to and acted on.

Keeping Ourselves Safe will be taught over the next three weeks. Two School Community Police officers are booked to teach specific KOS lessons and support classroom teachers. Units:

For children to love reading, they must read what they enjoy – be it a recipe book, song lyrics or even an audio book. This means that the Readathon is accessible to all readers.

We hope that the conversation around the readathon can engage wider whānau so the responsibility for motivation and sponsorship can be shared. Children can be sponsored to read per minute, per page, per chapter, per book – whatever motivates them. And there is no assessment at the end because reading for pleasure should be just that – fun!

There is a prize for the child in every class who does the most reading and the class that raises the most funds. Thank you for your support with this.

ENROLMENTS FOR 2023

Out of Zone Places

After significant years of growth Papakōwhai School is no longer at risk of overcrowding. In 2021 we hit our peak roll of 560 students. This year's roll is about 20 less children than last year and we are expecting the same reduction over the next few years. We have

managed the pains of growth and now we need to manage the challenges of reduction by carefully transitioning the school back to a roll size of between 465 and 510.

To carefully manage this transition, **the BOT have approved up to 10 out of zone places for 2023 at the Year 1 level.** There will be places for siblings of current students and there may be a limited number of places for students not currently linked to the school.

If you currently live <u>out of zone</u>, have children already attending Papakōwhai School, and you have a new entrant child who turns 5 in 2023 and you have not already completed an enrolment form for 2023 <u>please contact the office and complete an enrolment application</u> <u>by 1 September at the latest.</u>

The process is as follows:

•Pre-enrolment of out of zone Year 1 children need to be received by September 1st, 2022.

•A ballot for out of zone places will be held on September 2nd.

In Zone Places

To assist with planning for 2023 we need to check we have an accurate list of enrolments for next year.

If you fall into one of following categories, please contact the Office by Friday September 2nd:

i) You live <u>in zone</u> and have a new entrant child who turns 5 in 2023 and you have not already given pre-enrolment details to the Office.

ii) You live <u>in zone</u> and currently have a child attending a different school that you intend to enrol at Papakōwhai in 2023.

If you have a friend or family member that does not have a child currently attending Papakōwhai School and you think that they may fall into one of the above categories, or may be interested in the out of zone ballot, please get them to contact the Office also.

Leavers

If you have a Year 1 - 7 child currently attending Papakōwhai School and you are planning to enrol them at a different school in 2023 please notify the Office by Friday September 2nd.

If you are unclear about the boundaries of the school zone, please refer to our website. Please note all streets that are part of the "grandparenting clause" are counted as in–zone enrolments. If you have any questions or concerns about your child's eligibility to enrol at Papakōwhai School in 2023 please contact me.
