WELCOME BACK EVERYONE!!!!


Welcome back to the start of Term 3. The kids all seem well rested and ready to go on all cylinders for another big and busy term. We have a focus on our Natural Disasters for our theme work and will be doing some work on the upcoming Olympics.

Our strand in mathematics this term is proportions and ratios strategies and also a focus in statistics. Our writing focus will be based around explanation writing, as it ties in nicely to our natural disaster unit. Rugby, football and ki-o-rahi is our skill-based lessons for PE and also we are going to be doing some gymnastics as part of our wet weather PE programme. In art, we are working on sculpture and we will be doing some work with clay, play dough and plasticine. Term 3 is 9 weeks and we have plenty of opportunities for the students to have a good balance across the curriculum. There still will be plenty for the kids to do and we believe we have a good balance this term to ensure meaningful and positive learning takes place.
