Principal's comments:

Ngā mihi ki a Koutou Nau mai hoki mai, welcome back.

This term we have 10 weeks, school will finish on Friday 16th December at 1.00 p.m.

The days are getting warmer so we are asking that all children wear a brimmed hat when they are outside. If the children do not have one they are able to play in the shaded areas, such as- the pohutakawa tree outside the staffroom, in the sand[pit (under the roof), in the lunch area under the cover, and in the library.
