

Dear School Friends and Families



I was wondering: Why was Lumsden was named Lumsden? Come in Mr Google...Originally the district in general was known as The Elbow, then when the then new railway station was also named The Elbow,

residents of Castlerock brought the matter to George Lumsden of the Otago Provincial Council, who referred the matter to the Railways Department. They then chose the name Lumsden for the town in the absence of any other suggestion.

George Lumsden, Mr Google's P.A. Miss Wikipedia, went on to tell me that George Lumsden was a watch maker from Scotland who arrived in Invercargill in 1861, and was mayor for a couple of years. He later became a member of Parliament before resigning to re-focus his watch makers business.

With all due respect to Mr Lumsden, it sounds like he had very little to do with Lumsden, other than refer a complaint from some disgruntled Castlerockians about a name double-up to the Railways Department. And yet his name is immortalised on our signage and letterheads.



I imagine he was quite clever. Being able to make watches would have required a great deal of dexterity and specialised skill. He was probably a very busy man

too. He had eight children, a high level of political involvement, while running a business at the same time.

And like many of those early European settlers, he was probably courageous too, leaving his Scotland home, family and friends to sail off to the other side of the world to begin a-new.

So while initially thinking our town was a bit hard done by, with its name resulting from a somewhat flippant decision from the Powers-That-Be, on reflection, our name has good character as its origin. It seems to me that George Lumsden worked hard – to acquire specialist skill, to contribute to his wider community, and to support his family. He was prepared



to move outside of his comfort zone (emigrate to New Zealand) and seek new opportunities.

And I guess those are the sort of character traits that we want to nurture in our 'Lumsden' children – a keenness to learn, to contribute positively to society, and show initiative and seize opportunities.

Wondering satisfied, along with a meaning-enriched take on our 'Lumsden' vision and values. For me, yesterday the signage and letterheads were just labels. Today they're meaning-holders.

That's what's in the name.



This year our school was selected to participate in a nation-wide survey on school attendance. This graph shows our attendance levels for 2015 compared with other schools nation-wide and Otago/Southland schools. It is reassuring to see that Lumsden School had significantly high rates (the black line), comparing very favourably with schools nationally and across Otago/Southland.
