Tracy then told the story of Te Whiti o Rongomai and Tohu Kākahi. The story of Parihaka and passive resistance. I was extremely impressed with the way she told the story. She was able to clearly tell the story from both sides. Why settlers came to Taranaki and the need for land, and also from the tangata whenua side about retaining the land and finally the military's involvement with the confiscations. The Treaty of Waitangi was also touched upon. Tracy used clay puppets to help her tell the story. After the story telling each child created a mini flag of the Raukura (Toroa/Albatross Feather). We were not allowed to video the story telling but were able to take lots of photos.

A big thank you to all the parents that came along to support the juniors hikoi to the awa. As part of their unit study the juniors were looking at whitebaiting on the awa. Thank you to Bill Rona for taking time to talk to our tamariki.
