Dear School Friends and Families



I notice smoke coming from a few chimneys about town this week...Not such a good "summer" so far, so hopefully Big Yellow will make up for lost presence soon!

Great to see some of our children involved in the Northern Southland Variety concert in the Memorial Hall last night. It's always heart-warming to see children's enthusiasm for performing, and the confidence they have to get up on stage. Next weekend we have another group of children performing at the annual Lions Senior Citizens meal.

Our hardy golf team (Fynn, Troy, Mitchell, Mackenzie) braved the liquid weather at Drummond yesterday, representing Lumsden School at Southland competition level for the first time. Many thanks to Jason Herrick for transporting and managing the team (and enduring the wetness!)

Having collated achievement information this week, it has been very pleasing to see such a positive shift in children's progress, comparing this year's with last year's data. For example, of the 57 children



who were included in last year's data, 93% are achieving at or above their national standard in Reading (up 5%); 90% are at or above their national standard in Writing (up 15%); and 98% are at or above their national standard in Maths (up 14%). This reflects well on recent teacher professional development, intervention strategies for individuals and groups of children, and the engagement of our children in their learning.

We look forward to having the opportunity to discuss Room 2 and 3 children's learning with their parents at Parent Interviews next week (Tuesday and Wednesday). Hopefully those of you who returned slips will have received your time slot notification yesterday, or with this newsletter today.



At this time of year it's a bit of a challenge to keep all the balls in the air with so many to juggle (long list and tight timeframes), and so I'm very fortunate to have a staff that so often catch some of those balls for me whilst juggling

their own! Our school community is something to cherish I think, with such team-orientated teachers, supportive parents and a very dedicated board. Ultimately that's great for our kids.
