Room 3 – **Tyrece Squire** – For an outstanding effort using a wider range of strategies in maths.


Room 4 – <u>**Phoenix – Joy Brown**</u> – For a fantastic effort and getting all tasks finished.

Room 2 and 5 - Learning about Biodiversity at Lake Rotokare

Our Room 2 and Room 5 students have been learning about biodiversity and conservation with the educators at Lake Rotokare. They have been finding out about the Rotokare Project and the way in which they eradicate and control pests. Our students have also participated in outdoor activities and at stations in the bush classrooms. Tomorrow both classes will be doing a day trip to visit Lake Rotokare and the beautiful pest free environment there. They will get to look at different things, find things and listen to stories, facts and birdsong.
